RESOLUTION 2012-02

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTON LAKES, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SUBMIT A LETTER TO THE STATE COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS DETAILING THE CITY'S LEGAL AUTHORITY TO EXERCISE THE POWER OF EMINENT DOMAIN, AS REQUIRED BY SENATE BILL 18 ENACTED BY THE 82ND LEGISLATURE.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 18, enacted by the 82nd Legislature, requires all public and private entities that are authorized to exercise the power of eminent domain to submit a letter to the Comptroller of Public Accounts detailing their legal authority to exercise this power; and

WHEREAS, entities that fail to provide this letter by December 31, 2012, will cause that entity's power of eminent domain to expire; and

WHEREAS, the City of Weston Lakes is authorized to exercise the power of eminent domain through multiple provisions of state law, and

WHEREAS, to preserve this power the City Council deems it in the best interest of the City to authorize the Mayor to submit a letter to the Comptroller of Public Accounts detailing the City's authority as provided by law; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTON LAKES, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the City Council hereby approves the letter to the Comptroller of Public Accounts detailing the City's legal authority to exercise the power of eminent domain in substantially the same form as Exhibit A hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to submit the letter and any other needed documentation, to Susan Combs, the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, to preserve the City's power of eminent domain, as required by Senate Bill 18.

Dear Ms. Combs:

This letter is being provided pursuant to Senate Bill 18 amending Chapter 2206 of the Texas Government Code. Senate Bill 18, enacted by the 82nd Legislature, requires all public and private entities that are authorized to exercise the power of eminent domain to submit a letter to the Comptroller of Public Accounts detailing their legal authority to exercise this power.

The City of Weston Lakes, Texas (the "City") is a Type B general-law municipality. The City has the power of eminent domain expressly pursuant to Chapter 251 of the Texas Local Government Code. This power specifically derives from Section 251.001 and the exercise of this power is governed by Chapter 21 of the Texas Property Code.

In addition to the provisions identified above, the City reserves the right, if ever it is a homerule municipality, to exercise the power of eminent domain as authorized by the Constitution of the State of Texas unless a prohibition of the City's use of said power is set forth in unmistakably clear language in the Constitution, general laws or special laws of this State. Further, the City has the authority to exercise the power of eminent domain through entities that the laws of the State of Texas authorize the City to create, control, and/or participate in, that have been or in the future will be created by the City and that are or will be granted eminent domain power through general and special statutes adopted by the Legislature for that purpose, none of which are waived or abandoned by the City, directly or indirectly.
